Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis

What Is It?

PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis) is a medication that reduces your chances of getting HIV from sex or injection drug use.

How Effective Is PrEP?

PrEP is highly effective for preventing HIV when taken as prescribed.

- PrEP reduces the risk of getting HIV from sex by about 99% when taken as prescribed.
- PrEP reduces the risk of getting HIV from injection drug use by 74% when taken as prescribed.
- PrEP takes about 7-21 days to reach the level of protection depending on injection use & types of sexual encounters.

Eligibility for PrEP

- Must be HIV negative to be on PrEP
- PrEP is recommended for anyone with:
 - Unprotected vaginal or anal sex with a partner of unknown HIV status
 - A partner who is living with HIV (especially if partner's HIV viral load is detectable or unknown)
 - Recent STI infection
 - Injection drug use

Paying for PrEP

Most insurance plans and state Medicaid programs cover PrEP medication.

If you don't have insurance or a high deductible, there are programs available that provide co-pay assistance or PrEP for free.

PrEP Navigation

For those receiving PrEP through CMDHD have PrEP Navigation services made available to assist with:

- Appointment Scheduling
- Insurance & Pharmacy Issues
- Coordination of Required Labs
- PrEP Education

Appointment Testing & Follow Up

- Baseline testing at first appointment & annually will include:
 - HIV Testing
 - Metabolic Panel
 - Urinalysis
 - Hep B & C Testing
 - STI Screenings
- 30 day follow up to discuss side effects and barriers to adherence
- 3 month follow ups
 - HIV screening Ran EVERY visit
 - STI screening
 - Optional every 3 months
 - Recommended every 6 months
