For 2024, Ready.gov is focusing on preparedness in Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander communities. This theme aims to raise awareness about the special needs and challenges these groups face during emergencies.

"Helping these communities prepare for emergencies protects their health, well-being, and dignity during tough times," said Montie Schutz, CMDHD Emergency Preparedness Coordinator. "It's important to plan for their unique needs to keep them safe."

Build a Kit: Do you have a <u>basic disaster kit</u> for your home, work, and car? Do you have one to take if you need to evacuate? It's smart to store items in airtight plastic bags and then put them in easy-to-carry bins or bags. Think about any special needs, like pet food, medications, and medical equipment. Include items to help prevent COVID-19 and other respiratory illnesses.

Make a Plan: What is your family emergency plan? Businesses should have a plan too. Have you practiced any drills in the last year at home and work? The "<u>Do 1 Thing</u>" campaign is a great resource. By following a few simple steps each month, you can have a plan by the end of the year.

Protect Family and Property: Is your renter's or homeowner's insurance up to date? Find out if flood insurance is available in your area. Learn about the disasters that can happen where you live. It's also a good idea to make copies of important financial documents. The <u>Emergency Financial First Aid Kit</u> from FEMA is a helpful resource.
